Today, too many colleges are producing clones, who can't even look objectively at facts, let alone think through such facts.

I miss sanity, and mutual respect. One of the greatest honors I have had in my life, was to live for a decade in Hungary, beginning right after the Iron Curtain collapsed. Our children both went to Hungarian schools, which were places of learning. And wow, that country produces some of the smartest people on the planet. Those who got university degrees there were walking encyclopedias. There minds were trained to learn facts in every subject they could.

My having a doctorate opened many doors of learning, dialoguing, and comradery.
